The Chicago Yacht Club Foundation is a 501(c)(3) tax exempt charitable organization that promotes awareness and appreciation of maritime skills and traditions in Chicagoland through education, outreach, and activities as well as the support of likeminded charitable organizations.

Through our own programs and grants and by building partnerships with other clubs, associations, and schools, the Foundation is able to influence a wide range of youth. It is our core belief that access to the water should be independent of one's circumstances, needs, or abilities, and we therefore embrace all.

We do this because we believe that boating is fun, and that it also teaches important lessons in STEM skills, problem solving, building confidence, teamwork, and leadership. These skills apply in all parts of life, and it is important for us to share them with others.

The Foundation is the Platinum Sponsor of Open Horizons, an initiative of the Jackson Park Yacht Club Foundation. It targets low-income, at-risk youth of color to teach leadership, teamwork, and conflict resolution skills through sailing.

SOS CHILDREN'S VILLAGES ILLINOIS SAILING CAMP

SOS Children's Villages Illinois works to unite children in foster care and help them grow into caring and productive adults. In partnership with the Chicago Yacht Club Sailing School, the Foundation has created a sailing camp for SOS Illinois kids. During this immersive experience, students learn how to sail, are exposed to STEM subjects, and build teamwork skills.

CYC FOUNDATION MARITIME ACADEMY

This new Foundation initiative was designed to teach Chicagoland teens the skills needed to work on Chicago's many commercial boats. The 18 hours of training included everything from line handling and firefighting to CPR and first aid skills. The Foundation arranged a job fair after graduation and many participants were hired on the spot. With additional funding, the Foundation plans to expand this program substantially in 2023.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

The Foundation expands access to boating through scholarship programs. Margo Cicero is one such recipient. She started sailing at age 11 and received scholarships all through high school where she started the sailing team at Whitney Young High School. 

Civic & Community Outreach

CHICAGO CHILDREN'S MUSEUM ON NAVY PIER

The Foundation partnered with the Chicago Children's Museum on Navy Pier to develop an exhibit, "**Boats: Captain Your Own Adventure**." It provided kids with an interactive play experience designed to teach them about boating. Opening in May 2022, with the Foundation's support, more than 1,000 children from underrepresented communities enjoyed the exhibit free of charge.

UNION LEAGUE BOYS & GIRLS CLUB ANNUAL CRUISE

For over 100 years, Union League Boys and Girls Clubs have been serving the after-school development needs of Chicago's youth. The Foundation, in partnership with the Chicago Yacht Club's Power Fleet, offers a lakefront cruise to more than 60 kids from the clubs. Those interested in learning more about boating will be offered the opportunity to participate in sailing school with the support of the Foundation.



SOS CHILDREN'S VILLAGES ILLINOIS ANNUAL CRUISE

In conjunction with the Chicago Yacht Club's Cruising Sail Fleet, the Foundation offers more than 60 SOS Illinois children and their foster parents the opportunity to visit the Club for an educational program and lakefront cruise. Children interested in learning more about sailing will receive invitations to participate in the 2023 session of the SOS Illinois Sailing Camp.



Leadership Training



LEAD HER SHIP

The Lead HER Ship program is a signature program of the Foundation. Each year, up to ten young women, ages 14-17, embark on a five-day cruise on a tall ship in Lake Michigan. During the cruise, these young women learn to sail, and, perhaps more importantly, how to lead and work together. This year's successful trip was from the Detroit area to Suttons Bay. In 2023, the Foundation hopes to double the size of this program with two such cruises.



SEA SCOUT SHIP 5870 PRIVATEER

Sea Scouting is America's premiere onthe-water high adventure and personal development program. The Chicago Yacht Club and the Foundation support the Sea Scout ship Privateer, the oldest Sea Scout ship in the nation. The program teaches leadership, accountability, and self-reliance through maritime programs and is open to all children ages 14-21. The Foundation also offers a college scholarship to an outstanding Scout from the ship.


